

# Brooklyn, New York Bergen Beach Youth Organization Continental Amateur Baseball Association's 1998 - 2000 High School Age Division Champions

EUCLID- There aren't many teams that can lose the opening game of the championship round and come back and win the Continental Amateur Baseball Association High School age Division World Series.

Brooklyn Bergen Beach is one of those teams. The Bronx Bombers won their fifth title in a row and the eighth in the last nine years with an 8-2 win over Oakland-based North California in the final game of the tournament

It was a long climb back for Brooklyn after an opening 3-1 loss to Euclid, OH.

"We didn't swing the bats in that first game," coach Dennis Register said. "The pitcher kept us off balance. All we had to do was crank the bats up."

Brian McCann's second-inning homer got the New Yorkers started in the title game and Brett Groce added a solo blast in the third to make it 2-0.

A single by Chris Uithoven and a double by Sean Smith brought North California within 2-1 in the bottom half of the third, but it was to be his last hurrah.

A two-run double by Groce and a three-run homer by McCann ignited a five run fifth inning and booted North California starter Casey Beale out of the game.

North California answered back with one run in the bottom half of the frame, while Brooklyn's first run came in the seventh on McCann's RBI double.

"Brian McCann's hot bat has carried us the last three games," Register said.

McCann and tournament most valuable player Steven Register each had three hits and Groce had two as the winners mounted an 11-hit attack.

Register went the distance on the mound, limiting North California to just seven hits.

"The way the bracket was set up we could have played one more game, but we ended up playing the same amount," Register said. "I felt we had the pitching to go through."

"The kids didn't feel any pressure. It was a positive experience for the kids. We only had one player from last year, Macay McBride."

"If we played them 10 times, we beat them five times," North California coach Tony Crivello said. "It was just one of those days. We're good and they're good."

"We were a little thin on pitching and it caught up with us today. They're a good hitting team. We usually go to AAU and this is our first time at CABA. We had a great time and

Third-place Miami entered the final day unbeaten, but after a 9-5 loss to NorCal, fell to Brooklyn, 6-3.

An error on Bergen Beach pitcher Jason McCurdy staked Miami to a 2-0 third inning lead and the Floridians scored one time in the fourth to make it 3-0.

Back-to-back doubles by Clay Wehner and Kyle Keen brought Brooklyn to within 3-1 in the bottom half of the inning before a five-run fifth won it.

McCann and Keen belted two-run homers in the inning as the winners had half of their eight hits. McBride tossed a four-hitter at Miami.

It didn't look as rosy for Brooklyn on opening day as Jeff Warnock fired a six-hitter with five strikeouts and Ben Moerlein had two hits and three RBI in the Cleves upset win. Steve Register had an RBI for Brooklyn.

A three-hitter and nine strikeouts by Brandon Moss and a Brad McCann homer lifted Bergen Beach to a 2-0 win over Mexico City.
